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is proud to announce that the Festival ended **yesterday**, **October 9**, with an extremely successful response from the audience and the authors, who had their works screened in a masterful **HD Digital Cinema quality**.

With a screening program that contained both **feature** and **short films**, there were **250 competing works from 72 countries** as well as **Special Events** and **Masterclasses** that took place, over the Festival's 10 day-period, at **Gnomo Milano Cinema**, **Centre Culturel Français**, **Spazio Oberdan**, and **IULM University**.

The Gala Award Evening took place on Friday, October 8 in a fully packed 'Eight Column Hall' of Milan's Royal Palace, kindly set at the festival's disposal by the Culture Department of the Milan Municipality, in the presence of an audience comprised of authorities and international artists.

The **Gala Award Evening**, hosted by producer, director and writer **Bill Bristow**, along with the skilled vocal Trio '**The Blue Dolls**', formed by **Flavia Barbacetto**, **Viviana Dragani** and **Angelica Dettori**, honored the winners of the third edition of '**I've Seen Films**'.

The International Jury, formed by Miranda Richardson, Anton Corbijn, Roberto Faenza, Bill Bristow, Takehito Kuroha, Grazyna Torbicka, Cesare Vergati, Flavia Costa and Rutger Hauer assigned the following awards:

Best Short Film, 20th Century Fox H.E: 'Transit', by Chris Roche (UK)

"This film incorporates a rare psychological relevance to the present. Subtle and yet hard-hitting and, at the same time, a very much human, engaging and surprising story."

**Best Feature Film**, 20th Century Fox H.E: 'Tangled Up in Blue' by Haider Rashid (UK/IRAQ/Italy/ United Arab Emirates)

"Sensitivity, wit, provoking thoughts on the Iraqi political drama, giving a wider scope of observation regarding the bewilderment of people during today's tumultuous climate."

Best Fiction, 'Hymen' by Cedric Prevost (France)

"A movie that takes full advantage of the potential of black and white, to describe a story comprised of loneliness and tenderness."

**Best First Work**, Lombardia Film Commission Award: 'Donne di sabbia' by Rita Colantonio (Italy) "A rarity in the Italian film world for her instantaneous transformative capability, Rita Colantonio portrays with her multifaceted talent the many sides of a woman's soul. This film is a directorial debut that both moves and raises many interesting questions."

**Best Animation**, CortoWeb Award: **'L'homme qui dort'** by **Ines Sedan** (France/Argentina) "In an excellent example of how animated film can strike a deep romantic note, this film portrays a love story that is so surreal it needs pencilled strokes, yet so realistic it allows the audience to identify with the soul of the protagonists."

**Best Videoclip**, Microcinema Digital Network Award: 'White Swan' by Sil van der Woerd (the Netherlands)

"Stylistic, Bewildering, .. a very dark, futuristic background helps the beauty of the main character come alive, in a rhythmic merge of music and image."

**Best Music Performer Award**: **Anouk de Groot** for 'White Swan - Lolly Jane Blue' "Anouk de Groot, with her skill of musical and presentation lends a strange suggestive enchanting imagery to the screen."

**Best Art Film**, Comune di Milano Award: '41' by Massimo Cappelli (Italy) "The meaning of life is masterfully summed up in a few minutes. This high-tension thriller stages the concept of free will in a most involving way."

**Best Social Awareness Film**, President of the Italian Republic Award and 'Rutger Hauer Starfish Association' Trophy realized by the artist Dario Brevi to **'L'altra metà'** by **Pippo Mezzapesa** (Italy) "This film gracefully describes the 'age' considered to be old age. Mr Mezzapesa delicately enlightens us regarding the details of the everyday life in a hospice, while turning the journey into a deep and touching adventure."

**Best Actor**, CNR Media Award: **Ugo Dighero** with '41' by Massimo Cappelli (Italy) "First-class actor, Ugo Dighero, with his brilliant talent which engages on both a rational and emotional level, conveys the disturbing message of a predetermined future."

**Best Actress**, Best Movie Magazine Award: **Anna Sherbinina** with 'Hymen' by Cedric Prevost (France) "Anna Sherbinina skilfully portrays a very difficult character. Her face conveys profound melancholy, along with a strong and vital determination."

**Best Documentary Short Film**, MyMovies Award: **'Vivir del aire'** by **David Maciàn** (Spain) "With a wealth of detail and never before seen witness reports, Mr Macian travels back in time in an unforgettable and unusual journey into the memories of a 'behind the scenes' film artist. David also received a Special Mention on behalf of the protagonist of this documentary, Curro Savoy, who left a very personal, surprising and unparalleled musical feature, namely the whistling, in Sergio Leone's cult 'spaghetti-westerns'."

**Best Documentary Feature Film**, ICFILMS Award: 'La maglietta rossa' by Mimmo Calopresti (Italy) "Mimmo Calopresti, passionately with clear-cut and intense provocative images, masterfully communicates the account of a simple red t-shirt that will forever and indelibly represent both a sporting and political issue."

**Best Experimental Film**, EUNIC Award: 'No Sleep Won't Kill You' by Marko Mestrovic (Croatia) "This is an example of stream of consciousness where the filmmaker takes us on a psychedelic trip searching the mind of his character with the use of skilful editing, he dares to follow the devious route of a hesitant soul."

**Special Jury Award**: 'The Short Case of Record 12' by Simone Wendel and Mario A. Conte (Germany)

"A psychological, breath-taking thriller all the way through, an anguishing investigation skilfully pays a tribute to the Orson Wells and David Lynch classics."

The '20th Century Fox H.E.' Internet Jury Award went to 'Kool South' by Miles Goodall (South Africa)

"This is a South-Africa you would not expect: it is a luminous, multi-coloured kaleidoscope of creativity and playful transgression. Thanks to crisp and lively editing, it shows South-Africa's cool side."

A Special ICFILMS 'Music and Film' Award went to the singer, songwriter and actor Francesco Baccini, who competed with his short film 'Nerofuori' by Davide Bini and Emanuela Mascherini.

"For his innumerable and highly successful achievements in the music business as a singer, song-writer and performer, as well as for widenining now his horizons as he takes his music and his acting skills to the silver screen."

A **special ICFILMS 'Visual Arts' Award** was presented, during the Gala Award Evening, to the eclectic Dutch artist **Anton Corbijn**.

With arrivals from all over the world, all of the winning filmmakers attended the **Awards Ceremony** in **Royal Palace**'s **Eight-Column Hall**, in a fully-packed room.

The Blue Dolls Trio sang three musical pieces from their rich repertoire, accompanied by the orchestra directed by Maestro Paolo Volante (at the piano), with Marco Parodi on guitar, Luca Rigazio on drums/percussion and Riccardo Vigorè, the upright bassist. The Blue Dolls recently recorded the complete soundtrack (11 songs) of the TV mini-series 'The Queens of Swing'.

The awards were personally handed out to the authors by **Rutger Hauer**, who was on the stage with the multifaceted artist, **Anton Corbijn**, who also took part in handing out the award for the '**White Swan**' videoclip.

Also in attendance for the Gala were the Milano Municipality Culture Concillor Massimiliano Finazzer Flory, the President of the Lombardia Film Commission, Alberto Contri, and the Consul General of the Kingdom of the Netherlands, Johan S. Kramer, who during the party offered by the Dutch Consulate, cut the I'VE SEEN FILMS 'See you next year' cake along with Rutger Hauer.

The festival program included **more than 100 European and Italian premieres** relevant to the competing films, as well as the touching '**Armandino e il Madre**', produced by **Pasta Garofalo**, that featured **Valeria Golino** in her brilliant directorial debut.

'I'VE SEEN FILMS' has once again pioneered itself as the pacemaker, standing out among all other film festivals by having provided the authors the opportunity to watch their works screened in an HD Digital Cinema quality, thanks to the very high level of technical knowledge of the festival organization.

With Microcinema Digital Network and the support of the European Space Agency, the 'I'VE SEEN FILMS' works are distributed via satellite to more than 100 theaters belonging to this important circuit. Furthermore, this agreement also allows the diffusion of I'VE SEEN FILMS works through the Swedish Digitala Hus and the Spanish Anella Cultural networks, as well as through an African circuit as part of the ISIDE "I4A" cultural project, launched in cooperation with UNESCO, that since the month of December 2009 has been broadcasting some of the 'I'VE SEEN FILMS' works to the African communities in Burkina Faso, Burundi and the Democratic Republic of Congo.

All of the Festival's competing films were outstanding due to their high artistic and quality level. This year's competing author line-up included **Oscar**, **BAFTA** and **Emmy nominated and/or award-winning** filmmakers who came from all over the world to be in attendance.

All films were screened in their original language, with English subtitles. **Entrance was free** for all screenings, special events and masterclasses, for all locations.

**'I'VE SEEN FILMS'**, in cooperation with the **IULM University** in **Milan**, organized a **Masterclass** planned by PierPaolo De Fina, entitled '**Blade Runner: Remembering the Future'**, where the world's most famous replicant, **Rutger Hauer**, and his unforgettable 'Roy Batty' character entertained the students and the audience in a packed University Hall, for almost two hours, with a virtual journey of the most hidden secrets in the production of this cult legend of the filmmaking world.

Another Masterclass, planned by PierPaolo De Fina and Giancarlo Zappoli, was held in the Spazio Oberdan theater, entitled 'Festivals and Independent Film Promotion', whose speakers were Luca De Gasperin from Microcinema Digital Network, the artist Francesco Baccini, the Festival's director PierPaolo De Fina and the Co-Artistic Director Giancarlo Zappoli.

Always maintaining special consideration regarding air pollution and car traffic problems, 'I'VE SEEN FILMS', with its Main Sponsor 'smart', presented the most recent jewel of the German company: the marvellous and extremely practical 'smart fortwo electic drive'. It is a car that, with its 'zero emissions', solves the air pollution problems of our cities choked by smog and thanks to its very small size, eases parking problems.
